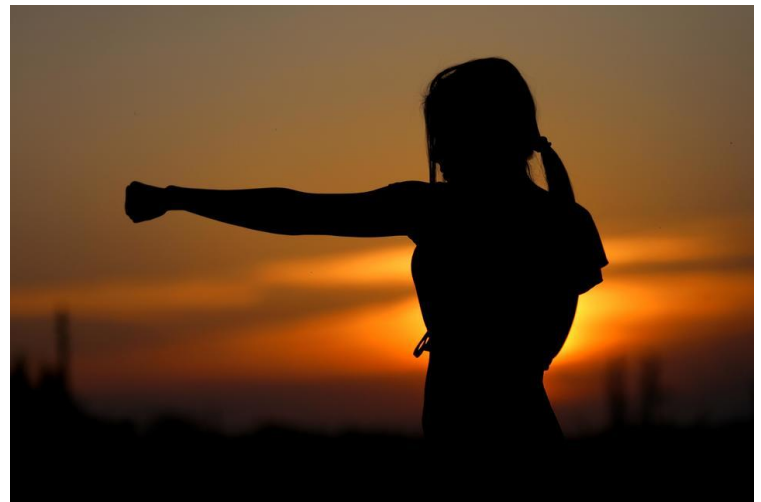
## HOW COMBATIVE MARTIAL ARTS GIVE RISE TO PHILOSOPHICAL QUESTIONS
