Philosophy is reflection on fundamental questions, such as: What is morality? Do we really have free will? Can we know anything with certainty? What distinguishes good reasons from bad ones? What is the relation between mind and body? What are the sources of our knowledge? What is truth? Is it wrong to eat non-human animals?

What is philosophy?

Philosophy is all about reasoning. It's about analyzing core issues and concepts, even basic assumptions, defending a position with arguments. The main sub-areas of philosophy are ethical theory and applied ethics, logic, epistemology (theory of knowledge), and metaphysics (nature of being and reality).

Why study philosophy?

Philosophy fosters skills in analysis, problem-solving, innovative thinking, and clear writing. Not surprisingly, philosophy majors have consistently ranked well on graduate entrance exams (LSAT, GMAT, and GRE). They develop skills transferable to many fields such as law, business, politics, program development, and mediation and arbitration. These skills are also useful in everyday life for making careful, reflective decisions on matters of importance.

Why attend VIU?

The philosophy faculty are friendly and dedicated to teaching and student-learning. Class sizes are small, facilitating student engagement and discussion in a supportive environment. A new honours program offers more in-depth study in philosophy. A new internship program helps students navigate the labour market and gain work experience in a professional setting. The main campus is in Nanaimo, BC — an inviting and affordable place to live.
